







A/B/C Design




Group Hourly Load Profiles




2018 savings were higher than the previous two years



2018 Event Participation.

Highest Rate of Full Participation


Decreased rates of connectivity loss or other dispatch failures



Event Participation by Group.

No Evidence of Event Fatigue

All three RCT groups had virtually identical rates of participation across the five categories



Key Takeaways

2018 Savings

RCT evaluation design yielded a robust estimate of savings.

Event Fatigue

No evidence of event fatigue in a 15 event season. Group A, B, and C event participation was nearly identical over the course of the season.

Control Group Size

The A/B/C design limited the control group size to 1/3 of the 2018 program population.
